Six monthly Compliance Report to conditions w.r.t. Environmental clearance from the MOEF to enhancement of Ore processing/beneficiation capacity from 9.55 million TPA to 14 million TPA in Rajhara Hills by M/s Steel Authority of India Limited (SAIL), located at District Durg, Chhattisgarh for the period from OCTOBER'2018 to MARCH'2019.

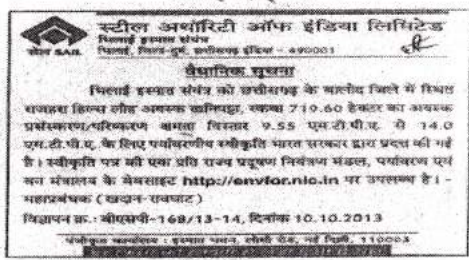

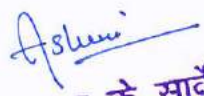
