 - 3. The existing O.B. dumps due to previous mining should be stabilised on priority by appropriate physical and biological reclamation measures to prevent water pollution and militation of the adjoining nallahs.
- The pollution control neasures for maintaining adequatair quality, water quality and noise level detailed in the revised EMP should be implemented in confirmity with the standards prescriped by Central/State Pollution Control Board under Environment (Protection) Act. 1986 Sufficient number of air and water quality monitoring stations should be set up. Six-monthly monitoring reports should be sent to this Ministry and Regional Office Bhubaneswar and to State Pollution Control Board.

- The project authorities should simplement mined area reclamation Has elaborated in the EMP, A green belt in non mineralized area should be developed.
- The project authorities should take up adequate socioeconomic measures including community development projects in the project impact zone.
- 7. The project should have a environmental management cell for monitoring the quality of environmental parameters, O.B. dumps rehabilitation, green belt development and other action plans for protection of environment.
- 8. A periodic progress report regarding the implementation of the EMP measures should be submitted once in 6months.
- 9. The funds garmarked for EMP measures including anti pollution measures should not be diverted for any other purposes.
- 10. This Ministry may stipulate subsequently any other condition as may be required in the interest of environemnt protoction.

The above conditions are Anforced among others under Water (Prevention and Control's of Pollution). Act, 1974 Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 and Environment (Protection) Act, 1986. Failure to comply with any of the conditions mentioned above would result in withdrawn of this clearance.
