OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Sub: Tulsidamar Dolomite Mine Project of SAIL - Environment
Clearance.

Reference is invited to Ministry of Steel's letter N
BB-14(18)/92 dated October, 19, 1992 and M/S SAIL's subsequent
letter No. EMD/RMD/01/731 dated 20th April, 1993 forwarding the
revised Environmental Management Plan for Tulsidamar Dolomite
Project.

The proposal alongwith the project documents have been
examined and environmental clearance is granted to this project
subject to following :-

1. The project involves diversion of 101.32 ha. of forest
land. The project should be taken up in the forest area
only after clearance under Forest (Conservation) Act
1980 is granted.
2. The company should surrender ~~101.6~~ 83.7 ha. of the land under
its mine lease to the concerned State authorities and
incorporated in the revised EMP.
3. The existing O.B. dumps due to previous mining should be
stabilised on priority by appropriate physical and
biological reclamation measures to prevent water
pollution and siltation of the adjoining nullahs.
4. The pollution control measures for maintaining adequate
air quality, water quality and noise level detailed in
the revised EMP should be implemented in conformity with
the standards prescribed by Central/State Pollution
Control Board under Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.
Sufficient number of air and water quality monitoring
stations should be set up. Six-monthly monitoring
reports should be sent to this Ministry and Regional
Office Bhubaneswar and to State Pollution Control Board.

5. The project authorities should implement mined area reclamation ~~has~~ elaborated in the EMP. A green belt in non mineralized area should be developed.
6. The project authorities should take up adequate socio-economic measures including community development projects in the project impact zone.
7. The project should have a environmental management cell for monitoring the quality of environmental parameters, O.B. dumps rehabilitation, green belt development and other action plans for protection of environment.
8. A periodic progress report regarding the implementation of the EMP measures should be submitted once in 6-months.
9. The funds earmarked for EMP measures including anti pollution measures should not be diverted for any other purposes.
10. This Ministry may stipulate subsequently any other condition as may be required in the interest of environment protection.

The above conditions are enforced among others under Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 and Environment (Protection) Act, 1986. Failure to comply with any of the conditions mentioned above would result in withdrawn of this clearance.
