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

I am directed to refer to you the Jharkhand Govt. letter No.Van Bhumi-64/2010-2461/Va.Pa. dated 14.07.2010, wherein prior approval of Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change for diversion of 30.43 ha of forest land for renewal of Jhillingburu-II Gua Iron Ore mining lease of M/s SAIL (ISCO) in Saranda Forest Division of Jharkhand, was sought in accordance with Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. After due consideration of the proposal of the State Government, the 'in-principle' approval of the Central Government for diversion of the said forest land was accorded vide this office letter of even number dated 29.01.2013 subject to fulfillment of certain conditions. The State Government of Jharkhand vides their letter No.Van Bhumi-64/2010-217/Va.Pa. dated 19.01.2023 have furnished compliance report in respect of the relevant conditions stipulated in the in-principle approval for grant of final approval.

In this connection, on the basis of the compliance report under reference, the final approval of the Central Government under Section 2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 is hereby accorded for diversion of 30.43 ha of forest land for renewal of Jhillingburu-II Gua Ore mining lease of M/s SAIL (ISCO) in Saranda Forest Division of Jharkhand, subject to the following conditions and stipulations:-

- (1) Legal status of the forest land diverted shall remain unchanged.
- (2) **Compensatory afforestation:** Compensatory afforestation shall be taken up by the Forest Department over 42 ha. degraded forest land (Village – Chandpur & Bondih RF under Porahat Forest Division) at the cost of the User Agency. As far as practicable a mixture of local indigenous species will be planted and monoculture of a species has to be avoided.
- (3) **The KML files of the area to be diverted and the CA area shall be uploaded on the e-Green watch portal before issue of final approval by the State Government of Jharkhand.**
- (4) The boundary of the diverted forest land, mining lease area and safety zone shall be suitably demarcated on ground at the project cost as per the directions of concerned Divisional Forest Officer.
- (5) User Agency shall restrict the felling of trees to minimum number in the diverted forest land and the trees shall be felled under the strict supervision of the State Forest Department after issuance of order from the DFO to the effect.

- (6) The user Agency either itself or through the State Forest Department shall undertake fencing, protection and afforestation with native species of the safety zone area (safety zone of 7.5 meter wide strip shall be kept within the mining lease or mining cluster, as applicable and such other areas as specified in the approved mining plan) at the project cost.
- (7) The period of diversion of the said forest land shall be co-terminus with the period of the mining lease granted under the Mines and Minerals (Development & Regulating) Act, 1957 or Rules framed there under.
- (8) The user agency shall undertake mining and reclamation and eco-restoration of the mined out area as per the approved mining plan and the directions of the concerned Divisional Forest Officer. The reclamation and eco-restoration operations should be undertaken with effective adherence to the techno-scientific aspects and emphasis on bio-diversity strictly with native species. User agency should endeavor to surrender such reclaimed area to the state forest department in appropriate temporal manner.
- (9)
 - (a) No labour camp shall be established on the forest land.
 - (b) The User Agency shall provide alternate fuels preferably LPG to the labourers and the staff working at the site so as to avoid any damage and pressure on the nearby forest areas.
 - (c) It will be the responsibility of the User Agency to ensure that the labourers and staff engaged in construction activity do not damage the nearby forest flora and fauna.
- (10) As landscape level compensatory measures to mitigate and offset the adverse impacts of mining activities in the Saranda forests, the User Agency shall make financial contribution for the execution of Integrated Plan(s) for Wildlife & Biodiversity Conservation, Catchment Area treatment and Watershed Management, in the prescribed proportion as per instruction of SFD, Jharkhand. Further, stipulations other than these, if any, mentioned in the Management Plan for Sustainable Mining in Saranda & Chaibasa shall be complied with by the User Agency.
- (11) The User Agency shall, under the supervision of concerned Range Officer of Forests, engage adequate number of members of local JFMCs and provide required tools for effective prevention and control of forest fires in the lease area and adjoining forests as per annual work plans approved by the DFO.
- (12) The User Agency shall undertake activities for development of village resources, infrastructure and welfare of the neighbourhood community.
- (13) The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other user agency, department or person without prior approval of the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change.
- (14) The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without the prior approval of the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change.
- (15) The forest area proposed for diversion shall not be used for any purpose other than that shown in the diversion proposal.

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- (16) The change in the layout plan of the mining lease, if required, shall be done as prescribed in the MoEF&CC Guideline F No. 11-42/2017-FC dt 29/01/2018.
- (17) The concerned Divisional Forest Officer, will monitor and take necessary mitigative measures to ensure that there is no adverse impact on the forests in the surrounding area.
- (18) User Agency shall obtain Environment Clearance as per the provisions of the Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986.
- (19) The user agency shall submit the self-compliance report in respect of the above conditions to the State Government and to the Regional Office of the Ministry on annual basis.
- (20) The user agency and the State Government shall ensure compliance to provisions of all the Acts, Rules, Regulations, Guidelines, Hon'ble Court Order(s) and National Green Tribunal Order(s) pertaining to this project, if any, for the time being in force, as applicable to the project.
- (21) Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and action would be taken as per the MoEF&CC Guideline F. No. 11-42/2017-FC dt 29/01/2018.
- (22) Any other condition that the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change may impose from time to time in the interest of afforestation, conservation and management of flora and fauna in the area, shall be complied by the user agency.

As has been mentioned at Para-2 of the Stage-II approval, this approval for diversion of forest land is subject to the fulfillment of stipulated conditions mentioned in this approval letter. Therefore, in the event of non-compliance of any of the conditions laid out in this approval letter, the Regional Office of Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change may withdraw the said approval for diversion of the forest land and stop the non-forest activity being carried out in the forest land besides initiating the legal action as per provisions of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980.

Sanction Order of the Site Specific Wildlife and Biodiversity Conservation Plan for diversion of 1698.862 ha of forest land for 04 mining leases namely Durgaiburu Iron Ore Mining Lease covering area of 1443.756 Ha, Jhillingburu-I Mining Lease covering area 210.526 Ha, Jhillingburu-II Manganese & Iron Ore Mining Lease covering area 30.43 Ha and Topailore Iron Ore Mining Lease covering area 14.15 Ha prepared in compliance with the condition laid by the MoEF&CC towards ToR of Environmental Clearance granted in favour of M/s SAIL, Gua Ore Mine located in West Singhbhum District of Jharkhand.

The instant Site Specific Wildlife and Biodiversity Conservation Plan (referred to as "the Plan" hereinafter) has been prepared by Ecos Offset Private Limited, Madhubani, Bihar on behalf of "M/s SAIL, Gua Ore Mining" hereinafter referred to as "the Project Proponent" in pursuance of the following conditions of the "in-principle" approval order issued by the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Govt. of India towards granting Environmental Clearance to Gua Iron Ore Mining Project (referred to as "the Project proponent" hereinafter) in West Singhbhum district of Jharkhand.

(1) The following condition has been laid by MoEF&CC under condition no 6 B (xxxvi) of environmental clearance approved vide his letter no J-11015/453/2008-IA.II(M) dated 25th March 2013 of Durgaiburu Iron Ore mining of Gua Ore Mines of M/s SAIL (mine lease area 1443.756 Ha) reads as follows:

"6 B (xxxvi). The project proponent shall take all precautionary measures during mining operation for conservation and protection of endangered fauna namely Elephant, Sloth Bear, Palm Civet, Panther, Mouse deer etc. spotted in the study area: Action Plan for conservation of flora and fauna prepared shall be implemented in consultation with the State Forest and Wildlife Department. All the safeguard measures brought out in the Wildlife Conservation Plan prepared specific to this project site shall be effectively implemented. Necessary allocation of funds for implementation of the conservation plan shall be made and the funds so allocated shall be included in the project cost. A copy of action plan shall be submitted to the Regional Office of the Ministry of Environment and Forests, Bhubaneswar."

(2) The following condition has been laid by MoEF&CC under condition no (iv) and (xxxi) of Stage-I Clearance/ In-principle approval vide his letter no J8-75/1998-FC (Vol) Dated 25th September 2017 of Jhillingburu-I mining lease of Gua Ore mines of M/s SAIL (mine lease area 210.526 Ha) reads as follows:

"(iv). The user agency shall abide by the condition issued by the State Government regarding the safe movement of Elephants. The State Government shall ensure that various mines are worked in such a way that the required elephant corridor/ intermittent vegetation zones are always maintained without any long gap/ disturbances. No mining operations will be carried out during the period of movement of Elephant and only working mining pits will be property fenced instead of creating a linear barrier for wildlife movement through fencing of safety zone around the whole mining leases.

(xxxi). No damage to the flora and fauna of the adjoining area shall be caused."

(3) The following condition has been laid by MoEF&CC under condition no II (iii) of environmental clearance approved vide his letter no EC/SEIAA/2016-17/2053/2017/297 Dated 10.12.2018 of Jhillingburu-II Iron & Manganese Ore Mining of Gua Ore mines of M/s SAIL (mine lease area 30.43 Ha) reads as follows:

"II. (iii). The project proponent shall prepare a Site Specific Conservation Plan & Wildlife Management Plan and approved by the Chief Wildlife Warden. The recommendations of the approved Site Specific Conservation Plan/ Wildlife Management Plan shall be furnished along with the six monthly compliance report. (in case of the presence of schedule-I species in the study area)."

(4) The following condition has been laid by MoEF&CC under condition no A. 6 of environmental clearance approved vide his letter no EC/SEIAA/2015-16/694/2015/1291 Dated 17.08.2015 of Topallore Iron Ore mining project of Gua Ore Mines of M/s SAIL (mine lease area 30.43 Ha) reads as follows:

"A. 6. The project proponent shall prepare a Site Specific Conservation Plan & Wildlife Management Plan and approved by the Chief Wildlife Warden. The recommendations of the approved Site Specific Conservation Plan/ Wildlife Management Plan shall be furnished along with the six monthly compliance report. (in case of the presence of schedule-I species in the study area)."

In the above stated background, the Regional Chief Conservator of Forests, Singhbhum Region, Jamshedpur vide his letter no. 300 dated 04.03.2025 has submitted the Plan to the office of the undersigned for its due sanction.

In order to examine the plan prescriptions a communication was issued to the Regional Chief Conservator of Forests, Singhbhum Region, Jamshedpur vide this office letter no. 275 dated 17.03.2025, to arrange a Power-Point Presentation of the plan on 24.03.2025 in the Office chamber of the undersigned. The presentation was made by the Project Proponent in presence of Regional Chief Conservator of Forests, Singhbhum Region, Jamshedpur, DFO, Saranda, Sri Kamal Bhasker, CGM (Mines), Sri T.P Dutta, GM, BSL, SAIL, Sri Alok Kumar Yadav, Sr. Manager (E&L), JGOM, BSL, SAIL, Sri Ravi Ranjan Kumar, Manager, BSL, SAIL, Dr. T.C Ananda, DGM, Gua Mines, SAIL, Sri Dharmendra Sethia, Dy. Manager (Env & lease), Gua Ore Mines, Sri Kislay Kumar, Director, ECOS Offset Pvt Ltd and Sri Anzar Anis, Technical Executive, ECOS Offset Pvt Ltd.

The plan with a total financial outlay of Rs. 6992.76 Lakh extends over a period of 10 years (Year 2024-25 to 2033-34; tentatively) out of which Rs. 5027.93 lakh shall be utilized by the Forest Department through DFO, Saranda Forest Division and Rs. 1964.83 lakh shall be utilized by the Project Proponent in accordance with the Plan prescriptions.

Considering the proposals under the plan, sanction is hereby accorded to the instant Plan subject to the following conditions:

- (i) That the Project Proponent shall ensure that its officials/contractors and the work force engaged into mining and allied operations under the Project shall not commit or abet any forest/wildlife offence in their area of operation. They will also promptly report any forest/wildlife offence in the area to the nearest forest office/official. Further, they will extend their full co-operation to the forest officials in control/mitigation of any incident, natural or man made, detrimental to forest and wildlife in their area of operation.
- (ii) That the total amount of Rs.6992.76 lakh involved in the instant Plan consists of two parts – Part A and Part B. Part B constitutes of a sum of Rs. 5027.93 lakh which shall be deposited by SAIL, Gua Ore Mines in favour of "Divisional Forest Officer, Saranda Forest Division" in Government Treasury, Chaibasa under the head "Van Preshan Lok Lekha (Praptiyan) Head 8782". DFO, Saranda shall withdraw money from the Treasury for implementation of the works mentioned in the duly sanctioned Annual Plans of Operation as described in the following paras, from "8782 Remittance Head" and maintain accounts under "Lok Lekha Head 8443". DFO, Saranda shall submit monthly account to the Accountant General, Jharkhand as per prevailing norms of the Forest Department. Part A constitutes of a sum of Rs. 1964.83 lakh which shall be utilized by the User Agency towards the activities mentioned in the plan as and when and in the manner as directed by the DFO, Saranda.

- (iii) That as regards the funds earmarked against activities to be undertaken by the State Forest Department, the DFO, Saranda shall prepare detailed Annual Plan of Operations (APO) at the beginning of every Financial Year in accordance with the activities mentioned under the Plan following all the rules, regulations, Schedule of Rates etc. issued from time to time by the State Government/ Forest Department. Regional Chief Conservator of Forests, Singhbhum Region, Jamshedpur shall accord sanction to the said APO following due process and he/she will closely monitor the implementation/progress of the activities undertaken by the Implementing Agencies as per directions issued by the Forest Department from time to time.
- (iv) That the Conservator of Forests, Chaibasa Circle (CF, Chaibasa) shall supervise all the activities as per directions issued by the Forest Department from time to time.
- (v) That the DFO, Saranda shall carry out the activities under the Plan strictly as per the duly sanctioned APOs.
- (vi) That the DFO, Saranda shall ensure that no violation of duly sanctioned Working Plan of Saranda Forest Division takes place during implementation of any of the activities involved in this plan over notified and demarcated forest land.
- (vii) That at least one year before the expiry of the instant Plan, the Project Proponent shall formulate and submit to the Forest Department another plan in continuation of the instant Plan. The impact of implementation of this Plan shall be evaluated by the competent authority.
- (viii) That the instant Plan is dynamic and may be revisited after every 2 years and a revised plan may be formulated as per need of the impact (buffer) area and convenience of the implementing agencies. The revised plan, if any, shall be put up before the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, Wildlife & Chief Wildlife Warden, Jharkhand for its approval.
- (ix) That though provisions have been made towards cost escalation in the plan, yet the Project Proponent shall submit an Undertaking to the DFO, Saranda to the effect that they will deposit extra cost of the Plan beyond the cost escalation provision owing to increase in wage rate, cost of materials etc. in due course of time as well as consequent upon revision of the plan, if any, as and when given effect to by the competent authority.

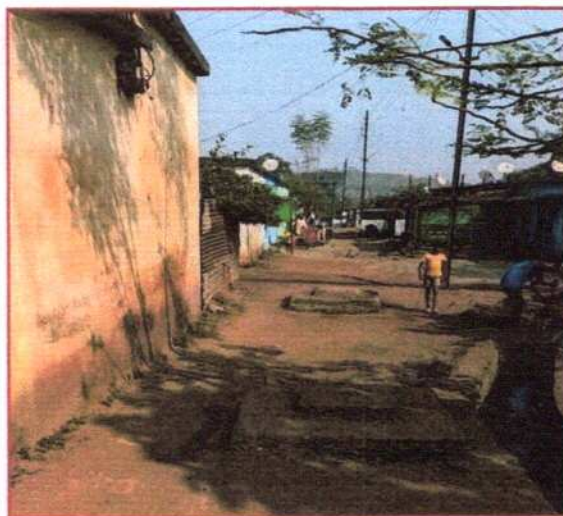

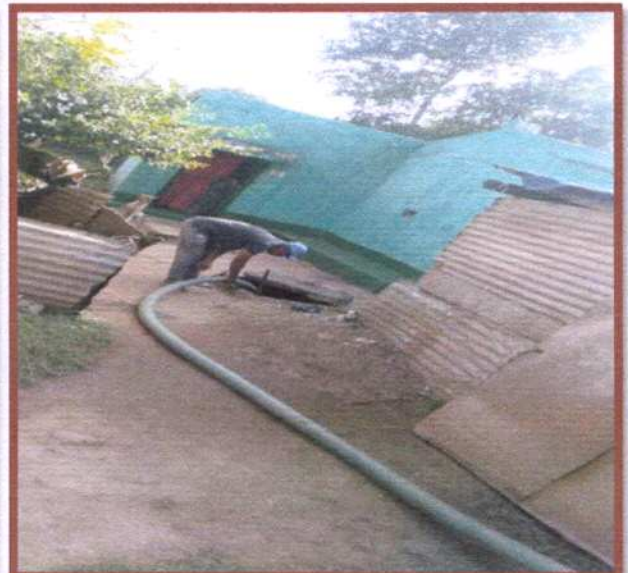
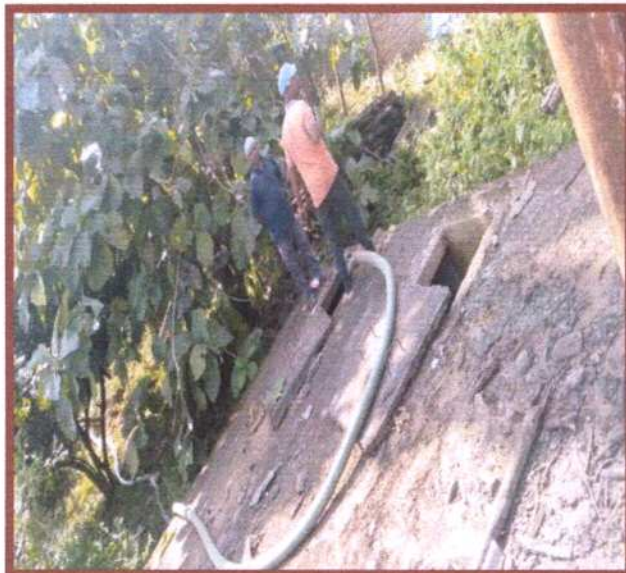
